1. General Code

GNU/Linux Club works on the premise that all ideas are worthy of discussion if a shared respect and courtesy for one another is maintained. Critical questions and thought partnering, and minority dissent, only serve to empower and make communities stronger. Exceptions to this include targeted harassment, abuse, or incitations to violence.

In the case of disputes, GNU/Linux Club admin team is the final arbiter of what constitutes acceptable behavior.
